


Background ATTCs

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

What best describes your field of work? (n = 187)








Needs Assessment Survey





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
Overall Strategic Framework



Current estimate








Change Leader Academy (CLA)

A key dissemination and training program of the NIATx process improvement model.


- 12 years
- Professionals from SUD, BH, Criminal Justice, Social Services
- It's simple & involves staff in the change process
- CLA in each of the 6 states





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Pre-work







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CLA Training

- 1-day only (9am to 3pm)
- Held in each of 6 states
- Change Leader Simulation
- Work and network in focus area groups:
 - ROSC
 - MAT
 - Access & Retention
 - Others (may vary by state)
- Participants carry out a 3-4 month change project in their agency







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Follow-up TA

Month 1

- Technical assistance call with a NIATx coach.
- Online learning communities (ROSC, MAT, etc.) - forums

• Month 2 & 3

- Focus area group conference call
- Project updates, accountability

Month 4

- Project completion
- 5x5 presentations
- Archive of innovation & change in practice



Change Leader & Organizational Benefits:

- CEUs
- NIATx Certified Change Leader
- An easy-to-use, standard change model for your organization.

- 1-day CLA training held in all 6 states, March-May, 2018
