

Social impact of Father Absence

63% of youth suicides are from fatherless homes.

90% percent of all homeless and runaway youths are from <u>fatherless</u> <u>homes</u>.

85% of children who exhibit behavioral disorders are from <u>fatherless homes</u>.

71% of high school dropouts are from fatherless homes.

70% of youths in State institutions are from fatherless homes.


75% of adolescent patients in substance abuse centers are from fatherless homes.

85% of rapists motivated by displaced anger are from <u>fatherless homes</u>.

Causes of Father absence

 Fatherlessness is a complex phenomenon produced by many circumstances and situations.
 Some are related to choices people make about fertility, marriage, and cohabitation. But others are the result of unexpected events, illnesses, or incarceration.



Contemporary causes of Father absence


- Having a culture that heavily stresses individualism
- Have an economic system that ignore familial obligations
- Have an educational system that does not stress childrearing as a major adult responsibility
- Sexualizing our society
- Make marriage a very weak institution
- Through the media and social discourse deemphasize the importance of children to the continuation of society
- Overlook the importance of fathering when discussing male gender roles
- Don't mention that fathers are unique and irreplaceable as protectors, challengers, disciplinarians and guides. Explain that the role of fathers is to be more like mothers: say that it is perfectly possible for "daddies to be good mommies".

The Father's role has shrunk drastically over the years. American fathers have been losing authority within the family and psychologically withdrawing from a direct family role in child rearing almost since colonial times.




When Mama is Daddy – things for the Single Mom not to do

- Raise him to think
 he's cute and let him
 think the world
 revolves around his
 cuteness
- Be involved with a steady stream of different men. Let him see how you manipulate men to get your needs met (bills, money, etc)
- Emphasize the importance of sexual rather than intellectual prowess
- Make your son you man. Not sexually but emotionally Keep him away from his father and put his father down



Things not to do cont.

- Let your son talk and act grown
- Let him hear you engage in sexual activity with different men in the next room
- When he gets into trouble make sure its always the other person or the teachers fault







When Daddy is Home

What Fathers do is different from mothers. Fathers style of parenting tends to be very complementary of what Mother's do and sets a tone for optimum child rearing.


- Play

The Criminalization of Father Absence

What we are seeing today are criminal penalties imposed on citizens who have committed no act but are made outlaws through the actions of others. This phenomenon proceeds largely from involuntary divorce and is affected by family courts.

The presumption of guilt pervades child support enforcement where the burden of proof may be shifted to the defendant according to one ruling. In clear violation of the constitution it has been held that "not all child support contempt proceedings classified as criminal are entitled to a jury trial," even indigent fathers are not necessarily entitled to a lawyer.





The Criminalization of Father Absence

Men are now forced to support children who are acknowledged not to be theirs biologically. Stepfathers are ordered to pay support for stepchildren. Grandparents and second wives are pursued by child support prosecutors. Minor boys statutorily and forcibly raped by adult women must pay child support to the criminals who raped them.


A presumption of guilt also pervades allegations of domestic violence made during custody proceedings, where a father's contact with his children is criminalized through <u>restraining orders</u> that are routinely issued with no evidence of wrongdoing whatever – orders that cannot protect anyone only prohibit a father's contact with his own children.



The Criminalization of Father Absence

No figures are available on how many fathers are incarcerated for "family crimes." Informal estimates put as much as one-third of the nation's jail population consisting of fathers on contempt-of-court charges. Some jurisdictions now propose creating forced labor camps specifically for fathers to relieve overcrowded jails. Not since the fall of the Weimar republic has a democracy treated millions of its own citizens in this fashion.



Addressing the collective socialization of Men

Male fear and vulnerability:

- Men often experience a disconnection dilemma
- If men are defined by strength, courage, toughness and control there is no room for victimization and fear
- Being a man and a victim are incompatible
- Fear, powerlessness and vulnerability require a disconnect from male gender role expectations

Thoughts on Intervention:

- A key recovery skill for men is the development of a broader range of options for expressing emotions and fear of being in healthy relationships
- Men also need to learn "relational mutuality"
- A key intervention is to build on strengths and "bridge skills"
- Reframing specific problem behaviors as survival skills from the family origin issues



Intervention Strategies: The use of male Archetypes

Archetypes might be compared to the "blueprints" contained in seeds. Growth from seeds depends on soil and climate conditions, the presence of certain nutrients care and support from the gardeners. Like wise archetypes are like an inner blueprint. They are metaphors for unnameable unconscious forces within all of us. Scientist often refer to it as the neurophysiological components of all human interactions

Male archetypes

King- the center of a man's world, blessing his psyche with self trust, creative order and a sense of profound mission

Prince – the sacred son, waiting to ascend to king.

Warrior-the part of ourselves that protects emotional boundaries and asserts our needs in the world

Explorer-the curious aspect of ourselves that embodies wonder

Magician - the part of us able to transform things, answer life's mysteries


